FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FROM SUSAN G. KOMEN CENTRAL GEORGIA

Nov. 20, 2014 - Susan G. Komen Central Georgia is proud to announce the availability of grant funds for FY2015. Grants will be made to support efforts to reduce breast cancer disparities in Baldwin, Bibb, Crawford, Houston, Jones, Monroe, Peach, and Twiggs counties. Based on a community needs assessment, Komen Central Georgia has identified the four following funding priority areas:

- Programs that increase the access to breast health services across the entire continuum
 of care and/or improve affordability of breast screening and diagnostic procedures for
 medically underserved populations.
- Programs that are culturally relevant and aim to eliminate cultural barriers, particularly in African American, Hispanic, and medically underserved populations.
- Programs that provide support programs or services that meet basic needs and facilitate
 quality of life during breast cancer treatment (e.g. nutrition, prosthesis, transportation,
 case management and navigation, emergency assistance, etc.).
- Programs that ensure the availability of breast health services in Komen Central Georgia's 8-county service area, with a priority to Central Georgia's target counties (Bibb, Peach, and Monroe).

The deadline for applications is January 15, 2014 at 5 PM.
